

Duty Statement for NRC Project Officer – World Moot Feasibility Investigation (Stage 1)

LENGTH OF TERM

Approximately 12 months

ELIGIBILITY

1. The position of NRC Project Officer – World Moot Feasibility Investigation (Stage 1) shall only be open to current invested Rovers.
2. Applicants must be eligible to remain a current invested Rover for the duration of the term.
3. Position is appointed via selection panel, for a 12 month term, with ratification of the appointment taking place at the next available NRC remote meeting.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Project Officer is to lead and investigation into the feasibility of running the 2029 World Rover Moot in Australia.

Areas to be investigated:

1. Is the event possible to run?
2. How could this event run and be supported by a federation of 8 Scouting branches and Scouts Australia?
3. Where will funding for the event and tender come from?
4. Are all the scouting branches willing to support a tender application?

Upon completion of the investigation a report is to be put together for presentation to the NRC and relevant national committees.

NOTES

The position of Project Officer – World Moot Feasibility Investigation (Stage 1) is a standing project officer role and a non-executive role of the National Rover Council.
