Duty Statement for Mental Health Resource Officer

Eligibility

- 1. The position of NRC Mental Health Resource Officer shall only be open to current invested Rover Scouts.
- 2. Applicants must be eligible to remain a current invested Rover Scouts for the duration of the term.
- 3. Applicants must demonstrate relevant knowledge and/or interest in mental health issues facing young adults in Australia.
- 4. Applicants who hold a Mental Health First Aid Certificate or qualifications or progress towards qualifications in areas such as Psychology, Social Work, Community Support and Mental Health are encouraged to apply.
- 5. Applicants are encouraged to complete their Rover Basic Training and obtain their Gilwell Woggle.

Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. Organise and lead a Project Patrol consisting of members from each Branch.
- 2. Review what Mental Health Support Structures exist in each Branch, and identify potential gaps in regard to the Rover Scout section.
- 3. Explore what support can be given to Rover Scouts, particularly for those organising events for Rover Scouts.
- 4. Investigate possible avenues of Mental Health training and education for Rover Scouts and Rover Advisers.
- 5. Investigate the introduction of content on 'Incidental Counselling' to On Demand Learning for basic training through the Rover Scout section.
- 6. Develop resources to be made available to BRCs for both awareness and education.
- 7. Liaise with existing BRC and/or Branch Mental Health Support structures where they exist
- 8. Liaise with the NRC Vice Chairperson for assistance
- 9. Attend NRC remote meetings and report on work done in the role.
