Duty Statement for Respectful Relationships Officer

Eligibility

- 1. The position of NRC Respectful Relationships Officer shall only be open to current invested Rover Scouts.
- 2. Applicants must be eligible to remain a current invested Rover Scout for the duration of the term.
- 3. Applicants must demonstrate relevant knowledge and/or interest in issues facing victims of sexual harassment and assault, state laws regarding consent, and cultural and organisational factors influencing perpetration of sexual harassment and assault.
- 4. Applicants are encouraged to complete their Rover Basic Training and obtain their Gilwell Woggle.

Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. Organise and lead a Project Patrol consisting of members from each Branch
- 2. Draft a 'National Rover Guideline on Consent', to be made available for use by events and Units.
- 3. Review sexual assault reporting policies in each Branch and survey Rover Scouts regarding their knowledge and understanding of these policies.
- 4. Survey Rover Scouts nationally on their understanding of Consent (pursuant to their State or Territory laws) and what constitutes Sexual Harassment and Assault.
- 5. Produce a report based on findings from Points #3 and #4 and make recommendations to the National Rover Council.
- 6. Explore possible content for the creation of an On Demand Learning module/s on the topic/s of 'Consent' and 'Sexual Harassment'.
- 7. Explore what national support can be given regarding sexual assault, and if there are additional resources required
- 8. Liaise with the NRC Vice Chairperson for assistance
- 9. Attend NRC remote meetings and report on work done in the role.
