- (2) Modify "Item 5.2.1 d)" of "PART 1: Article 5: Finance" as follows:

"The NRC Levy will increase by 2.5% each year according to the equation: Levy = \$7.50 x (1.025)^n per Rover Scout, where n is the number of years since 2020 (i.e. n=[current year]-2020)."
