Key items form these meetings were; how the organization intends to handle youth members turning 26 and some Branches still need to nominate a person to attend the National Youth Programing meeting coordinated by Jonathan Morey.

6. National Rover Training Review Update

A.Hilditch informed the council that the Face to Face meeting of the National Rover Training Review would be held in Victoria on the weekend of the 25th -27th of November. 12 members of the review team will be in attendance.

7. 2017 National Rover Council Conference

E. Bridger & A. Hilditch presented the 2nd information pack for the 2017 National Rover Council Conference. Minor changes from the previous version where that; everyone is now required to be at the



campsite by 1pm on Saturday the 7th of January and that participants have the option of staying at the campsite on the Monday night after the conference has closed before driving home the following day.

8. Centenary of Rovering

C. Houston spoke to the report, highlights where that there have been two productive remote meetings that have seen the formulation of initial plans for major activities and promotion during the centennial year. C. Houston has requested for feedback from the council on proposed welcome letters to crews and centennial moot.

9. 20th Australian Rover Moot - The Moot Report

Council members had several questions and queries regarding the moot that are minuted below.

Contingent teams require assistance of Moot Administration and I.T.to get contingent participant information so that Branches can assist with follow up to get fee's paid in a timely manor.

Can the Moot Organising Team add copies of the minutes of their meetings to the dropbox so that contingent leaders and Branch Rover Council Chairs can be kept up to date.

Can the Moot Human Resources directorate give a report on what welfare structures will be in place for The Moot?

In regards to selling Merch on site, branches voiced concerns over the tender process including the requirement that 10% of the acquired profits be retained by the Moot Organising Team.

The medical release recent updated requires participants sign off to several medical procedures in case of an emergency including blood transfusions, which could be discriminatory to persons of certain religious practices.

14. Branch Reports

14.1 Australian Capital Territory

S. Roald spoke to the ACT report, raised the challenges they face with participation within the branch and brainstorming ideas to get Rovers more involved. Also had issues at census this year with members' paperwork. As a result of this they ran workshops and produced welcome packs to inform members how to avoid these issues in the future. Achievements include 5 recipients of the BPSA, running a basic course and appointment of a Branch Rover Advisor and Assistant Branch Rover Advisor.

14.2 New South Wales

L. Painter spoke to the NSW report detailing the presentation of the National Rover Service Awards and the new NSW Rover recognition awards. NSW Branch Moot occurred since the last remote meeting and over 100 rovers have submitted applications to attend world moot next year. Challenges included a small decline in membership due to large number of Boots recently. Rover Basic Practical Supplement scheduled for this weekend. NSW looking for welfare support ideas from other Branches.

14.3 Northern Territory

L. Tibballs discussed the recent growth of NT rovers and the benefits the Branch had seen through Rover training with both National and South Australia. NTBRC is now an established meeting, only current challenges are membership numbers and gaining commitments of rovers to take on branch roles.

14.4 Queensland

B. Bath spoke to the QLD report, noting success in starting new events at both ends of the state, so that more members can participate in Rover run activities. QLD faces challenges with getting training course to occur due to numbers and interest.

14.5 South Australia

R. Hobbs discussed the achievements of membership growth through new crews starting up. Sandblast and a new event, Rover Retreat where a great success. Seven BP's and Seven National Rover Service Awards being presented on the weekend. BPS had 10 participants last weekend and SA rovers heading up to NT to run a basic course. SA enquired about how to go about getting the agreed funding for this.

14.6 Tasmania

A. Findlater spoke to the report, highlight success with Winter Moot. Challenged with ensuring new rovers meet membership requirements by completing Childsafe and WHS ELearning modules. TBRC was unable to go ahead at the rafting weekend due to lack of quorum, however the first BRC go to meeting was held successfully.

14.7 Victoria:

E.Bridger informed the council of the events Victorian Rovers had run since the last remote meeting including; C.A.R.B, M.A.R.B. and Rover Dinner. 25 Rovers where presented with their BPSA this year at Government House. The November BPS has 25 enrolled and is the third basic course being run for the year. Current challenges include getting enough interest to run an Advanced course as only one has run in the last 18 months.

14.8 Western Australia

R.Collins spoke to the WA report noting success with the Royal show and getting a few membership inquirers through a visible presence at the show. Motorsport event held recently was all successful given the poor weather. The New WARC Exec has been elected and take office in December, Steph Williams is the incoming WARC Chair.

15. General Business

15.1 Moot 2020: APR Recognition



The National International Commissioner requested that A.Boxall co-author an paper to present to the National Executive Committee in order to approach WOSM to grant APR recognition to the National Rover Moot Being held in 2020, hosted by ACT. Rational behind this was that the acting NRC would be in attendance at NEC were the paper would be discussed.

ACT raised that it would like the opportunity to discuss the APR as the branch responsible for organising the Moot in 2020. ACT also felt that it would be appropriate for Ben Muller be a co-author to the paper on behalf of both the Moot 2020 organising committee and ACT.

ACTION: A. Boxall to discuss with A. Cooper about circulating the APR paper to ACT branch for further discussion.
